Could you spare one hour every month, to support an inspiring social entrepreneur who is leading the change? We're looking for volunteers to mentor people in our next cohorts. You'll act as a critical friend and objective sounding board to a budding social entrepreneur - someone who is starting or scaling a project to tackle a problems such as poverty, climate change or ill-health.

This is a great opportunity to develop your mentoring and coaching skills, while learning about social entrepreneurship. You will be supported by the School for Social Entrepreneurs through mentor training and check-ins. The time commitment is to dedicate a minimum of one hour per month to mentoring.

Experience, skills and qualities

- Has started and run their own business / social enterprise / charity. OR
- Has an in-depth understanding of the process and challenges of starting and running a business / social enterprise / charity.
- Helps the student to solve their organisational and leadership challenges from a strategic perspective.
- Is a skilled listener and questioner who tends towards a coaching approach (asking probing questions) rather than a directive approach (giving advice).
- Is respectful and supportive towards the student and is able to quickly build a positive relationship of mutual trust and rapport.
- Is enthusiastic and interested in the students and organisations that SSE supports.

What types of challenges will the mentor support the students with?

This will vary depending on the stage of development of the organisation but might be...

Start Up stage

- Support to clarify the organisation's vision and mission
- Support to refine the business model and create a financially sustainable organisation
- Support to develop a business plan
- Issues with confidence, motivation and time management.

Growth stage (Trade Up and Scale Up)

- Clarifying organisational strategy and business planning
- Support with developing new income streams and new customer relationships
- Support with specific leadership challenges and people issues
- Issues with confidence, motivation and time management.

Commitment needed

- To commit to giving SSE a minimum of one hour per month of your time
- To attend training / induction sessions as required.
- To meet each student you are matched with a minimum of three times (more if the relationship is fruitful and you both wish to continue)
- To report back to SSE on a quarterly basis on how your mentoring relationships are going
- To receive feedback from your mentees via SSE and to discuss this with SSE's learning managers.
