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Introduction

The Business for Good Growth & Resilience programme is a FREE learning programme supporting you to develop new and existing skills and network with other socially minded or democratically owned businesses based in West Yorkshire. The programme is jointly delivered by the School of Social Entrepreneurs and Co-operatives UK and builds on both organisations experience of working with alternative businesses.

The Business for Good Growth & Resilience programme is part of the Business for Good, West Yorkshire programme which aims to provide specialist business support to Alternative Businesses (Social enterprises, co-operatives and community businesses) across West Yorkshire. Business for Good West Yorkshire is led by <u>TSL Kirklees</u> and delivered by a partnership of local providers - <u>Participate Projects</u>, <u>Voluntary Action Leeds</u>, <u>SEE Ahead</u>, <u>Co-op Culture</u> and <u>Stir to Action</u> supported by national organisations <u>Co-operatives</u> <u>UK</u> and <u>School for Social Entrepreneurs</u>.

The School for Social Entrepreneurs (SSE) was founded in 1997 by Sir Michael Young. We work with around 1000 social enterprises a year, helping leaders to start, scale and strengthen organisations that make a positive difference. But we're not a traditional school. Learning with SSE is inspiring, action-based and accessible – no textbooks.

As the voice of the UK's co-operative movement, Co-operatives UK empowers and supports co-operative enterprises with specialised knowledge and expertise, to grow the co-operative economy and create a fairer society.

The programme is funded by the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund. The UK Shared Prosperity Fund is a central pillar of the UK government's Levelling Up agenda and provides £2.6 billion of funding for local investment by March 2025. The Fund aims to improve pride in place and increase life chances across the UK investing in communities and place, supporting local business, and people and skills. Programme overview

The Business for Good Growth & Resilience programme will work with 20 representatives of alternative businesses which includes co-operatives, social enterprises and community businesses through access to a supportive learning and development programme. The programme will support alternative businesses to grow their impact with particular emphasis towards those creating and safeguarding jobs. The programme aims to:

- Develop entrepreneurial skills to help grow your organisation and/or safeguard jobs.
- Develop resilience and leadership skills.
- Develop strong peer networks of fellow entrepreneurs.

The learning programme will be focused on the needs of the participants and will be further defined once the cohort has been selected. Potential topics include:

- Business strategy planning and income streams
- Personal resilience and wellbeing
- Leadership
- Increasing financial resilience
- Impact measurement
- Environmental impact and decarbonisation
- Reaching new markets
- Governance & HR
- Social investment
- Contracts & commissioning
- Tech and Digital (for pivoting business model, new markets or just improving systems & processes)

The programme will have 20 places and will include:

- **5 Learning sessions** (all online) from May 2024 to October 2024. Learn from experts and leaders from the alternative business sector who will share their stories. There will be a bursary of up to £300 available to support your attendance.
- **3 Action Learning Sets** this is smaller group work with a trained facilitator, designed to support you to share successes and challenges and learn from one another. You can find out more about Action Learning <u>HERE</u>.
- 1:1 Peer Support buddy up with another programme participant to share ways of working and common challenges.
- **In-person site visits** (over 1 day) featuring a tour of multiple alternative businesses and peer networking opportunities (travel/expenses will be provided).
- Access a diverse network and build relationships with SSE, Co-operatives UK and other leaders within alternative business models enterprises.
- Celebrate your achievements at an in-person celebration event in October 2024.
- Access to a wider network of support through the Business for Good, West Yorkshire programme including specialist business coaches.











Who is this programme for?

The Business for Good Growth & Resilience programme will support representatives from alternative businesses who meet the following criteria:

- Your organisation is based in West Yorkshire (Bradford, Calderdale, Kirklees, Wakefield and Leeds)
- You have been trading for at least 18 months and able to demonstrate this via financial records showing an income of at least £15K over the last 12 months.
- You can provide evidence of your legal structure and governance documents. You
 may be a co-operative society or co-operative company, registered charity, a
 Community Benefit Society (CBS), registered society or a Community Interest
 Company (CIC). We can also accept limited corporations if you have a social
 purpose, majority restriction on profits, and an asset lock.
- Your organisation has a social or environmental purposes and/ or is democratically controlled and owned.
- Your aim is to make your business more resilient and ensure staff numbers are maintained or increased in the next 6 months.
- You are interested in supporting the growth of your enterprise through adopting new processes/technologies or
- You are planning to explore launching new markets, services or membership this year

We would particularly welcome applications from those who are from Black and minoritised communities, disabled people, LGBTQIA+ people and/ or those working with communities with less privilege.

Programme dates and location

All sessions will take place via Zoom (9am - 1.30pm), supported by resources on an online platform to enable participants to access information about the programme and wider resources. Delivery dates will be confirmed when the cohort has been selected.

How do I apply for the programme?

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Due to a limited number of places on the programme, please use our online <u>application form</u> to apply for your place on the programme. The deadline for applications is **12pm on 19th April 2024** however we strongly advise early applications. Applications will be assessed and the outcome will be communicated by the end of April 2024.

As part of the application, we ask you to provide your most recent full annual accounts if available, and if you are working with children and young people and/ vulnerable adults we will expect you to provide your safeguarding policy. If possible, please also provide a copy of current income and expenditure for this financial year, and any useful documents about your impact, such as a case study or impact report if you have one.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I apply if I have been on an SSE programme before or am currently on an SSE programme?

You can apply if:

- You have attended previous SSE programmes.
- You have applied to SSE before and were unsuccessful.
- You are on a current SSE programme which ends before April 2024.
- 2. Can I apply if my organisation has staff or trustees that are connected to SSE, Co-operatives UK or another partner connected to the Business for Good Partnership?

Please contact us before making an application to ensure that there is no conflict of interest.

3. Can another colleague attend in my place if I am unable to attend a session, or would benefit more from the subject matter?

To enable the cohort to bond and build rapport with the facilitator (and each other), we expect 1 representative per organisation to attend each session. If one of the session topics is more relevant to a colleague, you are able nominate your colleague to attend in your place, however this must be agreed with the facilitator before the session takes place. All programme participants should have autonomy to implement and share learning from the programme.
